

So, you want to have a “Summer Camp” experience for your students.

Welcome to Camp Kerr Lake’s guide to Summer Camps at the Lake. As you may already know, Shiloh Family Ministries, our parent nonprofit corporation, has hosted summer “resident” camps for students (3rd-8th Grades) since 2008. Many of our leadership have been involved in student ministries, and specifically youth camp ministries, for more than 30 years.

DIY Options. If you think you’d like to bring your group of students for some summer fun on the Lake, we can help you “tailor” your own “summer camp” program. We are very limited in our lodging, dining, and meeting spaces, so you’ll need to know what age groups, what genders, and how many students you’ll plan to bring to better evaluate your “Camp” options. You will be responsible for providing in-Lodge/in-Chapel counselors and support staff for every Option. These options are not available for all dates during our summer season and are completely dependent on the availability of volunteers and facilities, so if you are interested please contact our camp director as soon as possible.

We currently offer 3 different Options, and each Option is available for 2-5 nights.

Option 1 is our “bare bones” option where you simply “rent” the facilities you need (e.g. Lodges, Picnic Pavilion, conference room, etc.), and you do everything else (teaching, meals, recreation, devotionals, music, scheduling, counselors/chaperones, support staff, etc.). Pricing is based on the facilities you’ll be using and the number of days/nights you’ll be staying.

Facilities Rental Rates

· Picnic Pavilion	\$100/day
· Conference Room	\$100/day
· Propane Tank Rental	\$10/day
· Paddleboards/Kayaks/Canoes	\$70/2hr

Option 2 is more of a “partnership” arrangement sharing duties between our staff and yours. There are 4 variants of this Option.

Option “2A” (Teaching)

- Add Spiritual Teaching component
\$150/day (Morning and Evening Chapel Services)
 - Develop Spiritual Theme
 - Scheduling Chapel Speakers
 - Chapel Worship Music
 - Printed Daily Cabin Devotions (optional)
 - Memory Verse Cards (optional)

Option “2B” (Teaching/Recreation)

- Facilities Rental (as above in Option 1)
- Add Spiritual Teaching component
\$150/day
- Add Recreation Activities \$100/day

Option “2C” (Recreation/Meals)

- Facilities Rental (as above in Option 1)
- Add Recreation Activities \$100/day
- Add Meal Planning, Preparation, Service \$100/day+

Option "2D" (Teaching/Meals)

- Facilities Rental (as above in Option 1)
- Add Spiritual Teaching Component
\$150/day
- Add Meal Planning, Preparation, Service \$100/day+

Option 3 is our "fully programmed" option which, much like our annual Girls' and Boys' Weeks, includes all the lodging, dining, recreation, and spiritual activities. As with other Options, you will be responsible for providing in-Lodge/in-Chapel counselors and support staff.

Lodging Options. Our primary lodging facilities include 2 air-conditioned Lodges, one in the Recreation Area (Osprey Lodge), and one in the RV camping area (Eagle Lodge). Each of the Lodges has 4 “bedrooms” and one “central” room with 4 bunk beds in each room (sleeps 16 total). The “central” room also has a full-size refrigerator, coffee maker, and microwave, and some casual seating. The Lodges are very near our two main bath houses (hot showers, toilets, sinks, etc.) and adjacent to each Lodge is a metal carport with picnic tables and LP gas grill.



Dining. Our Picnic Pavilion serves as our primary dining facility and comfortably seats 60 at picnic tables. It is lighted and has four ceiling fans and two floor fans to assist in airflow. The Pavilion is equipped with a pantry including cabinet storage for paper goods/utensils, and a full-sized refrigerator-freezer with adjacent upright freezer for cold/frozen food storage. At the rear of the Pavilion is a covered concrete pad with LP gas grills and a food prep area.



Meetings. Our Conference Room, located in our Welcome Center/Camp Store building, serves as our primary meeting facility. It is air-conditioned and can comfortably seat 35 (theater-style). It has a video projector/screen, and a DVD/CD/BT sound system with HDMI/RGB/RCA connections.



Recreation Activities. We have a variety of recreational activities including paintball (target shooting gallery), canoeing, kayaking, paddle-boarding, swimming, field and water games, Box Hockey, Tetherball, Basketball, Pillo Polo, water balloon team slingshot, Slip'n'Slide, crafts (PVC racecars, marshmallow bazookas, etc.), scripture trail hiking, scavenger hunts, Hungry Hippo Live, Camp Kerr-lympics, etc.
